

SAFFTY NOTICES

Participation & Liability

- Personal Responsibility: All individuals participating in or observing Lauder Common Riding do so entirely at their own risk.
- Liability Disclaimer: Whilst every care has been taken by the organising committee and relevant landowners in facilitating these events, neither the organising committee nor the landowners accept any responsibility or liability for any injury, damage, or loss incurred by participants or spectators.
- Insurance Requirement: It is the sole responsibility of participants, or their legal guardians in the case of minors, to ensure they have adequate and appropriate insurance cover for personal injury and third-party liability.
- Competence & Equipment: Participants must ensure both they and their mounts are suitable and competent for the event. Wearing appropriate protective clothing, including approved headgear, is mandatory. Berets, Glengarrys, and bowlers (including safety bowlers) are strictly prohibited. All participants should take all reasonable steps to ensure their own safety and that of others during the event.
- Traditional Protocols: Riders and spectators must respect the traditional protocols associated with the Common Riding.
- Steward Instructions: Participants must comply with the instructions of the Mounted Marshals and Foot Stewards, who will be identifiable by Marshal armbands or highvisibility jackets.
- Enforcement: The Head Marshal reserves the right to remove any rider from the event for non-compliance with these instructions. The safety of riders, spectators, and horses is paramount.

Horsebox Parking

- Location: Horsebox parking is provided in the grounds of Thirlestane Castle.
- Access: Access will be via the main 'Eagle Gates' entrance on the B6362.
- Directions:
- From the north: Turn left onto the A697 at Carfraemill roundabout, signposted for Coldstream, then continue for approximately 5 miles before turning right onto the B6362 signed for Lauder.
- From the south: Turn right from the

- A68 onto the B6362 just before Lauder, signposted for Coldstream.
- Restrictions: Horseboxes will not be allowed access to the centre of Lauder, and there will be no parking at the Burn Mill on the Galashiels road.

Vehicle Parking Restrictions

- Wednesday (Fancy Dress Parade): No vehicles parked in The Avenue, Mid Row, Market Place, and West High Street (except in lay-bys off A68).
- Thursday (Preliminary Ride): No vehicles parked in The Avenue until after horses depart at 6:15 p.m.
- Saturday (Common Riding Day): No vehicles parked in Mid Row, Market Place, West High Street, The Loan, Stow Road (to Upper Loan Park), Edinburgh Road, The Row, Castle Wynd, East High Street, Mill Wynd, and Whitlaw Road (to the Fire Station). All these areas will be marked with cones.
- Waterin' Stane: At the Waterin' Stane, vehicles are requested to park in designated areas under the supervision of stewards.
 No cars will be allowed to pass the stewards unless they have an official parking pass.
- Golf Club Area: In the interests of safety, please refrain from parking at the Golf Club. Stewards will ask any drivers to divert via Threepwood Crossroads to minimise the risk to pedestrians.

Spectator Safety

- Safe Distance: Spectators are asked to stand a safe distance from the cavalcade at all times and not to try to cross the path of any horses.
- Assistance: In the event of any problem or emergency, please immediately notify the nearest foot steward or mounted steward.
- Litter: Please tidy your litter; any litter should be deposited in the nearest bin or taken home.

Young Rider Medals

 Collection: Young Rider medals for Common Riding Day will be available to collect at the Waterin' Stane by any riders under the age of 12.

will be looking down on us and wishing everyone a Safe Oot, Safe In



LAUDER COMMON RIDING - Riders Code of Conduct

- 1. MARSHALS WILL BE IN CHARGE Marshals 7. TIMING Punctuality is essential. We must will be clearly identified by armbands and will be stationed throughout the ride, following the direction of the Head Marshal. Foot Marshals will be suitably attired and positioned as required at gates and crossings. All riders must show full respect for, and comply with, any instructions given by marshals.
- 2. RESPONSIBILITIES OF HORSE RIDERS -All riders are responsible for maintaining control of their horses throughout the ride. If a rider becomes dismounted, they must either remount and rejoin the ride or return their horse to the designated horsebox area. While marshals may assist, it is not their duty to retrieve or control loose horses.
- 3. DISCIPLINE AT GATES AND CROSSINGS - Riders must exercise a high degree of discipline and courtesy at all gates and crossings. In some situations, it may be necessary or preferable to pass through a gate or crossing in single file and regroup on the other side—marshals will advise accordingly.
- 4. ROUTES Routes are pre-arranged in collaboration with the Common Riding Committee, farmers/landowners, and the police. All riders are required to follow the agreed route at all times. If a rider must leave the ride early, they must notify a marshal in advance.
- 5. DRESS CODE To uphold our high standards, all riders must wear smart, appropriate riding attire. This applies equally to anyone joining the ride at any point.

Suitable protective headgear must be worn by all riders.

The following headwear is strictly prohibited: Berets
 Glengarrys
 Bowlers (including safety bowlers)

Riders not complying with these dress requirements may be excluded from the ride.

6. BASIC MANNERS AND COURTESY - Riders must always display respect and courtesy toward fellow riders, marshals, members of the public, and especially the farmers and landowners who generously permit access to their land.

- maintain high standards of timekeeping to assist the police in managing public road access and to ensure timely arrival at key locations. This is also a courtesy to the public, who eagerly await the Cornet's arrival. Timing will be managed by marshals.
- 8. EMERGENCY PROCEDURE In the event of any incident—such as damage to property, broken tack, or injury to horse or riderimmediate contact must be made with a Mounted or Foot Marshal. Appropriate actions will be taken (e.g., first aid, veterinary assistance, spare tack). All related costs are the responsibility of the rider or horse owner/
- 10. GENERAL CONDUCT a. Any rider found to be under the influence of alcohol and unable to control their horse will be immediately excluded from the ride at the discretion of the Head Marshal.
- b. Riders must not ride on pavements under any circumstances.
- c. Foul or abusive language or any behavior creating a public nuisance will not be tolerated and may result in removal from the ride.
- d. All riders are expected to support the marshals in upholding these rules.
- e. Any rider who cannot maintain pace with the riding marshal may be asked to leave the ride.
- 11. INSURANCE It is the responsibility of all participants—or their legal guardians in the case of minors—to ensure that they have appropriate and adequate insurance cover for personal injury and third-party liability. Riders must also take reasonable precautions to ensure their own safety.
- 12. YOUNG RIDERS Young or inexperienced riders must be accompanied by a responsible and capable adult at all times. This adult should introduce themselves to the marshal in charge prior to the ride.



The Scottish Fire and Rescue Service have identified an increase in dwelling fires within the Scottish Borders over the previous two quarters compared to previous years, with over 93% recorded as accidental.

This sadly also resulted in two fire deaths within the locality, on each occasion, these were individuals over 65 who were living alone. These incidents have a significant impact on, not only the families involved, but also within the communities themselves, and to those responding to these incidents within their local communities.


- Many of us know a friend, relative, neighbour or client, often living alone, who could be vulnerable from fire.


The sun rose sae rosy, the grey hills adorning,
